### Thought for the weekend: Are we ever hypocrites?

Perhaps the very worst insult which you can make of a Christian is to call them a hypocrite. Jesus was at his most critical with the Pharisees, who he regarded as hypocrites. Yet when they criticised Jesus for healing on the Sabbath, they truly believed that they were upholding the laws of God. This is a terrifying thought, could we also sometimes be mistaken? Are we sometimes hypocrites like the Pharisees, without even realising it? It is possible, and to avoid falling into the trap, we must always listen to the word of God and put Gods ways into practice. When we view faults in others, each time we must remember that there are few sins which we are not capable of ourselves. A good way to avoid hypocrisy is to always remember, "there but for the grace of God go I."

#### PRAYER FOR THIS WEEKEND:

This is a prayer from the Manual of Eastern Orthodox Prayers to help us guard against hypocrisy: Set our hearts on fire with love for you, O Christ our God, that in its flame we may love you with all out heart, with all our mind, with all out soul, and with all our strength, and our neighbours as ourselves, so that in keeping your commandments, we may glorify you, the giver of all good gifts.
