Thought for the weekend: Burn spirit burn, set our hearts on fire

At Pentecost we have the opportunity to remind ourselves that we must never be too busy, too tired, too poor, or even too spiritually apathetic to face up to the task which God has called us to do. To be able to respond positively, we must open ourselves to allow the Spirit of God to move us. Images of the Holy Spirit often show tongues of fire, leaping around in all directions. This is a good way of stressing that the Spirit is uncontrollable. It is not a fire that can be constrained within a grate and behind a fireguard; in the case of the first disciples it was a fire which rendered them powerless to control it. By our very nature, most of us do not like losing control, we like to manage and legislate everything, including our emotions. However, Pentecost reminds us the Holy Spirit is not to be controlled, as Christians we must allow the Holy Spirit to fill us and take us over.

PRAYER FOR THIS WEEKEND:

This is one of the Collects for the Feast of Pentecost: Holy Spirit, sent by the Father, ignite in us your holy fire; strengthen your children with the gift of faith, revive your Church with the breath of love, and renew the face of the earth, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
