Thought for the weekend: What does it mean to be truly free?

Zeno of Citium was a stoic who lived around 200BC. He thought of free will as being something like a dog being tied to the back of a cart. The dog could walk around a bit but ultimately where the cart went the dog had to go. In his opinion, life was like that. We each have to accept our limitations, what could be changed and what was fixed. Compare that to the words in Ephesians today from St Paul. Put on the armour of Christ he urges, and when you have done that, you will be equipped to take on not just the world but the cosmic powers! In other words, we are no longer tied to the cart. However, it isn't just all plain sailing. Jesus makes clear that we must be ready and prepared for the challenges that go with being free.

PRAYER FOR THIS WEEKEND:

This is a prayer for clear vision, to follow Jesus freely: Lord, may we be prophets in the church today, as in the days of old, making known your living truth in the power of the Holy Spirit. Give us a clear vision of your purpose for the life of the world; enable us to speak the word with boldness; and through our words and actions recall your people to simpler discipleship, holier living and to more dedicated service for the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ.
